This free **Hawaiian Penguin crochet pattern** includes step-by-step instructions, detailed shaping, easy-to-follow stitch counts, and lots of fun accessories like a bikini top, flowers, and a grass skirt. Whether you're an advanced beginner or an experienced amigurumi maker, this joyful and vibrant penguin will definitely brighten your crafting time!

Finished size: approx. 20 cm (may vary depending on yarn, hook size and tension). This tutorial requires basic crochet skills and ability to read amigurumi charts.

Materials

Gazzal Jeans - color 1119 (white), 1109 (light blue)

YarnArt Jeans - 77 (orange), 36 (pink)

Gazzal Baby Cotton - color 3433 (black)

Various yarn leftovers in different colors (preferably thin thread). For flowers and the grass skirt, you may split thicker yarn into 2-3 strands.

Safety eyes without backing - 12 mm

White fleece for eye backing

Black fabric marker

Polymer clay in orange and red (for the beak)

Crochet hooks: 2.0 mm for body and swimsuit, 1.75 mm for flowers/grass

Craft wire – 1.5 mm × 35 cm

Scissors

Strong thread for sculpting (tightening)

Stitch marker

Glue: Moment, B7000/T8000, or hot glue

Acrylic paints

Acrylic varnish (to coat the beak)

Thin and medium brushes

Bra hooks (for the top)

Stuffing (fiberfill)

Abbreviations

MR – magic ring

slst – slip stitch

ch – chain

turning ch – chain for turning

sc – single crochet

dec – decrease

inc – increase

dc – double crochet

(...)× – repeat instructions inside parentheses

BLO – back loop only

FLO – front loop only

3-in-1 – 3 sc in the same stitch

dec3 – decrease 3 stitches into 1 stitch

All parts are crocheted cross-stitch style in spiral rounds, unless otherwise noted.

Hawaiian Penguin – HEAD – Part 1 (White)

Marker stays at the center back of the head.

1: 6 sc in MR2: inc $\times 6 = 12$ 3: (1 sc, inc) $\times 6 = 18$ 4: (2 sc, inc) $\times 6 = 24$ 5: (3 sc, inc) $\times 6 = 30$ 6: (4 sc, inc) $\times 6 = 36$ 7: (5 sc, inc) $\times 6 = 42$ 8: (6 sc, inc) $\times 6 = 48$ 9: (7 sc, inc) $\times 6 = 54$ 10: (8 sc, inc) $\times 6 = 60$ 11-22: 60 sc (12 rounds total)

23: 14 sc, inc, 13 sc, dec, (14 sc, inc) $\times 2 = 62$ 24: 21 sc, inc $\times 6$, 3 sc, dec, 3 sc, inc $\times 6$, 21 sc = 7325-27: 73 sc (3 rounds)

28: (9 sc, dec) $\times 3$, 2 sc, dec, (10 sc, dec) $\times 3 = 66$ 29: (9 sc, dec) $\times 6 = 60$ 30: (8 sc, dec) $\times 6 = 54$ 31: (7 sc, dec) $\times 6 = 48$ 32: (6 sc, dec) $\times 6 = 42$ 33: (5 sc, dec) $\times 6 = 36$ 34: (4 sc, dec) $\times 6 = 30$ 35: (3 sc, dec) $\times 6 = 24$ 36: (2 sc, dec) $\times 6 = 18$

→ Stuff the head lightly.

Face Sculpting (Cheeks & Beak)

Eye width: 5 stitches eachSpace between eyes: 5 stitches

Cheeks tightening (do twice for strength):Path 0 → 1 → 2 → 0Insert into next stitchThen path 0 → 3 → 4 → 0Repeat to tighten more.

Beak tightening:Path 0 → 1 → 2 → 3 → 4 → 0Repeat with stronger tension.

Hawaiian Penguin - HEAD - Part 2 (Black)

1: 6 sc in MR2: inc $\times 6 = 12$ 3: (1 sc, inc) $\times 6 = 18$ 4: (2 sc, inc) $\times 6 = 24$ 5: (3 sc, inc) $\times 6 = 30$ 6: (4 sc, inc) $\times 6 = 36$ 7: (5 sc, inc) $\times 6 = 42$ 8: (6 sc, inc) $\times 6 = 48$ 9: (7 sc, inc) $\times 6 = 54$ 10: (8 sc, inc) $\times 6 = 60$ 11-12: 60 sc

Marking for shape:From beginning of next round count 7 sc, mark the 8th.Count 7 more, mark 7th.Count 7 more, mark the 8th.

Turned Rows Begin

13: Turn. Crochet backwards until 1st marker, turn.→ ch 1, skip 1 st, 37 sc, slst, turn.

14-36:ch 1, 37 sc (no skipping).These are 23 rows.

Edging Round (Black piece)

37: In the last sc worked: 2 sc (total 3 sc in 1 st = corner),then:

- 12 sc
- 1 hdc
- 1 dc
- inc in dc2tog
- 1 dc
- inc in hdc
- 4 hdc
- 14 sc
- 1 hdc
- inc in dc
- dc2tog
- inc in dc
- 1 hdc
- 11 sc

- 4 hdc
 - inc in hdc
 - 1 dc
 - dc2tog
 - 1 dc
 - 1 hdc
 - 11 sc
 - 3 sc in 1 st (corner)
- slst to finish.

Fasten off. Place black piece over the white piece like a cap.

Attaching the Black Piece

Attach black yarn in the center top of black part:

- ch 6
- slst to join with white part
- 6 sc back along the chain
- slst to base.

Sew the black part to the white head using black cotton thread.

EYES – Hawaiian Penguin

Cut white fleece pieces according to the sculpted eye shape.

Glue them onto the face (I use B-7000).

Embroider eyelashes using black yarn split into 3 strands.

Embroider eyebrows.

BEAK – Top Part (Orange)

Crochet in an oval.

1: ch 62: Starting from 2nd ch from hook:

- 1 sc, 3 sc, 3 sc in last ch
- Continue on the other side of chain:
- 3 sc, 2 sc in last st (12)

3: (1 sc, inc) × 6 = 184: 18 sc (shape and straighten)

Fold in half and crochet 9 sc along the edge. Fasten off.

Tip: Slightly stretch the center to give it a teardrop beak shape.

BEAK – Bottom Part

Same as top part but stop after Row 2, so it stays smaller. Fold in half, crochet 9 sc along the edge, leave tail for sewing.

TONGUE (Red Yarn) – Hawaiian Penguin

1: ch 32: 1 sc into 2nd ch from hook, inc = 33: ch 1, 3 sc4: ch 1, (dec, 1 sc) = 2 sts5: Crochet around to round the shape, forming a teardrop.

Pin all 3 parts (upper beak, lower beak, tongue) and sew neatly.

FEET (Each foot has 3 toes)

Make 3 toes, then join them.

TOE (Make 3 per foot)

1: 6 sc in MR2: (1 sc, inc) × 3 = 93-4: 9 scDo not cut yarn on the last toe.

Joining 3 toes

5:

- Toe 3: 9 sc
- Toe 2: 5 sc
- Toe 1: 9 sc
- Toe 2 (remaining): 4 sc

slst to Toe 3 = 27

6: (7 sc, dec) × 3 = 247: (6 sc, dec) × 3 = 218: (5 sc, dec) × 3 = 189: (4 sc, dec) × 3 = 1510: (3 sc, dec) × 3 = 12

11: 7 sc, ch 3, skip 5 sts12: 7 sc, 3 sc along the chain = 10

13: (1 sc, dec) × 3, 1 sc = 7Pull yarn out. Fold the piece in half and sew the edge closed. Hide the yarn.

Insert wire shaped like toes into each toe.Lightly stuff the toes.

Resume crocheting where the hole is:

14-16: 12 sc

UPPER WINGS / ARMS (Make 2) - Hawaiian Penguin

Black yarn - worked in the round.

1: 6 sc in MR2: inc × 6 = 123-10: 12 sc11: (1 sc, dec) × 4 = 812-14: 8 sc

Now switch to white yarn and crochet in turned rows:

Row 1: ch 2, 3 sc in 2nd ch from hookRow 2: ch 1, inc, 1 sc, inc = 5Rows 3-7: ch 1, 5 scRow 8: ch 1, 1 sc, 2 dec = 3Rows 9-11: ch 1, 3 sc

Edge around with sc.Sew white piece to the inside of the flipper.Lightly stuff.Leave long tail for sewing to body.

Hawaiian Penguin - TAIL (Black)

1: 6 sc in MR2: (1 sc, inc) × 3 = 93: (2 sc, inc) × 3 = 124: (3 sc, inc) × 3 = 155: (4 sc, inc) × 3 = 186: 18 sc, slstCut yarn.

Hawaiian Penguin - BODY (Black)

Start from the inside center of the right foot.

1: 12 sc around the foot, ch 5, 12 sc around the second foot, 5 sc along chain = 34
2: 12 sc on foot, 5 sc on chain, 12 sc on foot, 5 sc = 34
3: inc \times 34 = 68
4-10: 68 sc (7 rounds)

11: 4 sc, inc, 18 sc, 9 sc together with the tail, 25 sc, (inc, 4 sc) \times 2, inc = 72
12: 24 sc, 9 sc with tail, 39 sc = 72
13-17: 72 sc (5 rounds)

18: (10 sc, dec) \times 6 = 66
19-20: 66 sc
21: (9 sc, dec) \times 6 = 60
22: 60 sc
23: (8 sc, dec) \times 6 = 54
24-25: 54 sc
26: (7 sc, dec) \times 6 = 48
27-28: 48 sc
29: (6 sc, dec) \times 6 = 42
30-35: 42 sc (6 rounds)

Stuff firmly. Begin attaching arms.

36-37:

- 12 sc
- 4 sc together with arm (white side facing outward)
- 16 sc
- 4 sc together with second arm
- 6 sc = 42

38: (5 sc, dec) \times 6 = 36
39: (4 sc, dec) \times 6 = 30
40: (3 sc, dec) \times 6 = 24
41: (2 sc, dec) \times 6 = 18

Fasten off, leave long tail for sewing to the head. Stuff firmly. Tip: insert a wire into the neck for better support.

WHITE FRONT BODY PANEL

Worked in turned rows.

1: 4 sc

2: ch 1, inc, 1 sc, inc = 5

3-5: 5 sc

6: ch 1, inc, 3 sc, inc = 7

7-10: 7 sc

11: inc, 5 sc, inc = 9

12: ch 10, from 2nd ch \rightarrow 18 sc, ch 10

13: From 2nd ch \rightarrow 27 sc

14: inc, 25 sc, inc = 29

15: 29 sc

16: inc, 27 sc, inc = 31

17-24: 31 sc (8 rows)

25: 14 sc, dec, 15 sc = 30

26: 13 sc, dec × 2, 13 sc = 28

27–29: 28 sc

30: 12 sc, dec × 2, 12 sc = 26

31–33: 26 sc

34: 9 sc, inc × 3 (chest), 2 sc, inc × 3 (chest), 9 sc = 32

35: 9 sc, (inc, 2 sc) × 2, 2 sc, (inc, 2 sc) × 2, 9 sc = 36

36: 36 sc

37: ch 1, 16 sc, skip 4, 16 sc = 32

38: ch 1, dec × 3, 20 sc, dec × 3 = 26

39: ch 1, dec, 22 sc, dec = 24

40: ch 1, dec, 20 sc, dec = 22

41: ch 1, dec, 7 sc, dec × 2, 7 sc, dec = 18

42: Edging around the whole piece

- sc around edges
- Corners: 3 sc in same stitch
- Top edge: (2 sc, dec) × 5 = 15

Pin the white panel to the belly. Stretch while sewing for a smooth fit. Lightly stuff the chest before closing.

SWIMSUIT – BOTTOM (Pink)

Back Part (turned rows)

ch 5, from 2nd ch → 4 sc

1: ch 1, inc, 2 sc, inc = 6
2–3: 6 sc
4: ch 1, inc, 4 sc, inc = 8
5: ch 1, inc × 2, 4 sc, inc × 2 = 12
6: 12 sc
7: ch 1, inc, 10 sc, inc = 14
8: 14 sc
9: ch 1, inc, 2 sc, ch 8 (opening for tail), skip 8, 2 sc, inc = 16
10: ch 1, inc, 14 sc, inc = 18
11: 18 sc
12: ch 1, inc × 2, 14 sc, inc × 2 = 22
13: 22 sc
14: ch 1, inc × 2, 18 sc, inc × 2 = 26
15: ch 1, inc × 2, 22 sc, inc × 2 = 30
16: ch 1, inc × 2, 26 sc, inc × 2 = 34
17: 34 sc
18: ch 1, inc × 2, 30 sc, inc × 2 = 38
19: 38 sc
Fasten off.

Front Part

Attach yarn at starting point.

1: ch 1, inc, 2 sc, inc = 6
2–8: 6 sc
9: ch 1, inc × 2, 2 sc, inc × 2 = 10
10–12: 10 sc
13: ch 1, inc, 8 sc, inc = 12
14: ch 1, inc, 10 sc, inc = 14
15: 14 sc
16: ch 1, inc, 12 sc, inc = 16
17: ch 1, inc × 2, 12 sc, inc × 2 = 20
18: ch 1, inc × 2, 16 sc, inc × 2 = 24
19: ch 5, from 2nd ch → 4 sc, 24 sc, ch 5
20: From 2nd ch: (inc, 3 sc), 27 sc, inc = 34
21: ch 1, 34 sc

Assembling the Bottom

Sew front and back together at the sides.

22: Along front edge: 45 hdc
23: Along back top edge: 38 sc, join to front with sc, then 45 hdc along back edge
24: 34 sc across front
25: ch 4 (2 serve as turning chains), skip 2, 1 dc, (ch 2, skip 2, 1 dc) × 23, slst to ch-4
26: (2 sc in each ch-2 space, 1 sc in dc) × 24 = 72
27: Crab stitch (reverse sc) across, skip every other stitch
Fasten off.

BRA (Pink) – Hawaiian Penguin

1: ch 42 + turning ch
2: From 2nd ch → 42 sc
3: ch 1, 42 sc
4: ch 1, 14 sc, 4 dc-increase (into BLO), 6 sc, 4 dc-increase (into BLO), 14 sc
5: ch 1, 14 sc, 8 dc, 1 sc, 2 dec, 1 sc, 8 dc, 14 sc
6: ch 1, 14 sc, 8 dc, 4 sc, 8 dc, 14 sc
7: ch 1, 14 sc, 8 dc, 1 sc, 2 slst, 1 sc, 8 dc, 14 sc, slst

Sew bra hooks.

Straps

8: On the back side, skip 5 sts, attach yarn at 6th st → 8 sc, attach to st 14. Repeat on the opposite side.

GRASS SKIRT (Hook 1.25 mm) “Grass Blade”

1: ch 17
2: 3 sc, 1 hdc, 2 dc, 7 dc2tog, 2 dc, 1 hdc, sc
Work the same on the opposite side of chain.
Fasten off.

Make 24 blades. Thread them onto a 100 ch chain in green yarn. Tie around the waist.

FLOWERS (Headband)

Hook 1.25 mm.

Tip: Use one color for rounds 1-2, and another color for round 3.

1: 5 sc in MR
2: inc × 5 = 10
3: slst, (ch 3, 4 dc in one st, ch 3, slst) × 5

Make 9 flowers, arrange on head, sew overlapping slightly.

Leaf for Crown

1: ch 7
2: From 2nd ch: 2 sc, 1 hdc, 1 dc, 1 sc
Repeat on opposite side, slst, fasten off.

NECKLACE FLOWERS (Smaller)

1: 5 sc in MR
2: (slst, ch 2, dc, ch 2, slst into same st) × 5

Make 6 flowers. Sew on a chain base. Make two 30-ch ties and attach to ends. Tie around neck.
